He is the source of my joy. I want to share his Gospel with everyone. I want to share the Lord with you. My motto, "Serve the Lord with Gladness," guides how I try to live my life.

No doubt you know that just like any big city and large diocese, we face many challenges together: the COVID-19 pandemic, ongoing racial tensions and widening political divisions. We cannot ignore these challenges. But, as Christians, we trust that God provides for us. Christ is even now praying that we might all be one. Jesus wants to lead us to receive his peace. Jesus leads us forward to a future full of hope. The Gospel is simple. Jesus Christ died for us and rose for us and told us to die to self so that we might rise again with him. We move from death to life – that is always the direction of our Church. It is the direction that our Church offers to our society. It is the message that all of us are called to proclaim – that Jesus saves us from those things that want to destroy us. We should not be shy about proclaiming this good news.

Thank you for your warm welcome. I come as a stranger, but I hope to become a friend and a brother to all of you. As I begin to make my way around our diocese, never hesitate to introduce yourself if you see me here and there. I look forward to connecting with you on social media and through Northeast Ohio Catholic magazine so that we can get to know each other better.

And finally -- and most importantly -- let's always keep each other in prayer and support one another on our journey of faith.

Our regular meeting will be on Tuesday, September 22nd at 7PM in Utopia Hall. Masks are MANDATORY. All Holy Name members are welcome.


CATHOLIC COMMUNICATIONS CAMPAIGN


