# PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD APRIL 2, 2023

#### FROM THE CORNER OFFICE

What the heck?!? <u>Did you notice</u> that change-up? The first reading of the **Gospel of Matthew**, begins our liturgy with the crowd praising **Jesus** as he enters **Jerusalem**, yelling "*Hosanna*! Hosanna!" and even waving the palm branches. Then next - yes, the readings this day "get right into it!" The next reading from the **Book of the Prophet Isaiah**, talks of the humility of the prophet, even to the point that you would think that the writer is speaking of **Jesus**. The **Psalm** questions **God**, asking if we have been abandoned, (again) as if it was **Jesus** asking the question. The very brief passage from **St. Paul's** letter to the **Philippians** continues to talk about the humility of **Jesus** and then **God** greatly exalting him! The *Passion of our Lord* from the **Gospel of Matthew** now lays the foundation of our salvation and our all! Year-after-year we read these passages leading us into *Holy Week*. The hope is that this year we may notice <u>the change-up</u>; maybe in our lives, maybe in our families, and maybe (even) within our parish.

Take time this week to pray over these readings – <u>and then</u> – **pray more!**
