THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD AUGUST 6, 2023

FROM THE CORNER OFFICE

This week we celebrate the **Feast of the Transfiguration**. The line from **St. Peter**, "Lord, it is good that we are here..." may not be one that we readily say each week as we drag ourselves and our kids to church – <u>BUT</u> it is actually **GREAT** that we are all here! We may not see it, but with each week, with each prayer, with each time that we push ourselves to grow in our faith, we are "**Transforming**" ourselves and those around us.

The First Reading tells us of the vision of **God**, the **Son of man**, and the others. As **St. Peter** tells us all in the Second Reading, "...we had been eyewitnesses to his majesty." 
