



Thanksgiving Canned Food Drive - The STM students, families, and parishioners have once again gone above and beyond to help serve our Brooklyn community this Thanksgiving season! We received an overwhelming amount of donations between the school and parish this year. Everyone did an outstanding job, and our final total was 4,505 items! Thank you to our STM parishioners for their donations of 381 food items. The three school classes that contributed the most donations this year were 6th/7th grade (578 items), 8th grade (811 items), and 3rd grade with a remarkable 1,365 items! This year's canned food drive was organized by our 6th-8th grade Student Government members. These students not only collected our donation items from the other classrooms but also organized, counted, packaged, and helped load them for pick-up by the City of Brooklyn representatives. We are so incredibly proud of the continued dedication and service of our STM school and parish families this vear!
