POPE BENEDICT XVI

Joseph Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI) was born on April 16, 1927 in Marktl am Inn, Germany and passed away on December 31, 2022 at the age of 95. On April 18, 2005, cardinal Joseph Ratzinger was elected the 264th successor St. Peter and chose the name Benedict XVI. His papacy testifies to both a scholarly churchman, having extensively studied theology and philosophy, and pastoral sensitivity. When elected pope at age 78, he didn't anticipate traveling the globe given his age and health, but quickly realized that the best way to reach the people of God was to go to them. He attended the first World Youth Day in Germany just months after his election. On February 28, 2013, Pope Benedict announced his resignation, becoming the first pope in almost 600 years to resign from the papacy. (usccb.org)

ST. THOMAS MORE SCHOOL

Since the first Kindergarten journal entry, the students have come a very long way already! In addition to the students continuing to practice rhyming, syllables, and initial, medial and final sounds, the students are progressing to practicing reading and writing CVC words. We are also practicing manipulating sounds in words by changing just one letter. Before Christmas break, the students even got together in partners to read a decodable reader! In math, the students have progressed to making and reading addition number sentences. The students can identify the plus and equal sign and they understand that two small numbers can be joined together to make a bigger number.

During the school day, we continue to practice how to be respectful, responsible, safe, and engaged in the classroom. We are doing this by practicing how we use our whole body to show respect to someone who is speaking. The students have also been going to Mass in person for the past several weeks. I am very impressed and proud of how well they respect and understand the presence of our Lord in the church and in the tabernacle. I am very much looking forward to seeing them again and watching them continue to grow closer and closer to becoming first graders!
