FROM THE CORNER OFFICE...

This week being in quarantine is nothing like the rest and "take it easy" people have talked about with me. I appreciate all of the concern and the staff coming together to keep things running. At the time of this writing, I have *no symptoms or concerns* at this point. The way that this all came about is that I was "exposed" since I was visiting a person who later was taken to the hospital and tested positive for the virus. The person was tested twice prior, and tested negative for the virus. So, being that I and the staff were concerned not to chance spreading anything, I volunteered the self-quarantine. The chance to step "to the side" did free up time to concentrate on more office work for the administration side. I am keeping up with the daily mass schedule, which helps me to pray the mass intention, and all of you as a parish. It has really been nice to pray for and with all of you this week in a special way.

The readings come together in a nice way, which is helpful. The first reading has Moses telling the people of a prophet and the need then to listen. This runs parallel with the Gospel of Mark, which has even the unclean spirits listening to Jesus and asking, what have you to do with us...? The <u>unclean spirits</u> – even find themselves listening to the word of God! But, here is the beautiful line, which I have picked and prayed over this week in my reflection time: "I should like you to be free of <u>anxieties</u>." Paul speaks with that authority, which echoes what is mentioned in both the 1st & 2nd readings... Paul lets the Holy Spirit speak through him, when he says Don't Worry! This is what we can take forward, that yes, no matter what!...be free of anxieties!

"YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH"

Pope Francis has declared an entire year dedicated to St. Joseph. The Year of St. Joseph began on December 8, 2020 and continues until December 8, 2021.

A beloved, tender, obedient father

Saint Joseph, in fact, "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home," writes Pope Francis, quoting his predecessor St. Paul VI.

And because of his role at "the crossroads between the Old and New Testament," St. Joseph "has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people" (PC,1). In him, "Jesus saw the tender love of God," the one that helps us accept our weakness, because "it is through" and despite "our fears, our frailties, and our weakness" that most divine designs are realized. "Only tender love will save us from the snares of the accuser," emphasizes the Pontiff, and it is by encountering God's mercy especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation that we "experience His truth and tenderness," - because "we know that God's truth does not condemn us, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us" (2).

Joseph is also a father in obedience to God: with his 'fiat' he protects Mary and Jesus and teaches his Son to "do the will of the Father." Called by God to serve the mission of Jesus, he "cooperated...in the great mystery of Redemption," as St. John Paul II said, "and is truly a minister of salvation" (3). To be continued...
