These summer lessons continue this week for us all. The daily readings, during the week, presented lessons from *St. Paul* writing to the *Corinthians* and the *Gospel* of *Matthew*. Paul continues talking about the duality of the flesh and spirt, so we are called to live in Christ; this same Christ who tells us to have faith. This week, let's look at our personal storms, and listen to Jesus asking us to have faith. That will be the point where we will see our 'Perfect Storms' are really just a passing shower, so go and play in the puddles!


RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK
