WHY A LIVING ROSARY IN OCTOBER?

The Blessed Mother appeared to the children of Fatima, Portugal on May 13 in 1917. She continued to appear on the 13th of each following month for six months, with her last appearance being on October 13, 1917. This year marks the 106th anniversary of the Fatima Miracle.

During her appearances she gave warnings about the future if man did not return to Christ and pray the rosary frequently. Some of those predictions were, World War I, World War II, the spread of Communism in Russia and others. Many of Her predictions came to be and we honor Her in the month of October because on Her last appearance she identified herself as "The Lady of the Rosary".

Reportedly there were three "secrets" of Fatima, that the Blessed Mother revealed to the children.

She left us with 15 promises if we faithfully pray the rosary. Please join our Parish as we conduct our 9th annual Living Rosary on Saturday, October 7th at 2:00pm in the church parking lot. More information will be forthcoming at a later date. This year we are again offering the opportunity for participants to request a recitation of one rosary prayer for a special intention, maybe a deceased loved one, an anniversary or just for oneself.

ROSARY UPDATE

NEW SCHEDULE:

FIRST FULL WEEKEND OF THE MONTH, EFFECTIVE JULY.

WHY:

The First Five Saturdays Devotion

BACKGROUND:

On December 10, 1925, Our Lady appeared to Sr. Lucia, one of the Fatima visionaries. in the following way:

"See, my daughter, my Heart encircled by thorns with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Do you, at least, strive to console me. Tell them that I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to me, on the First Saturday of five successive months, go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, say five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for a quarter of an hour, meditating on the ... mysteries of the Rosary."

Jesus then appeared to Sr. Lucia on May 29-30, 1930, and gave her the reason behind the five Saturdays devotion. It is because there are five types of offenses and blasphemies committed against the Immaculate

First: Offenses against the Immaculate Conception.

Second: Offenses against Our Lady's Perpetual Virginity.

Third: Offenses against the Divine Maternity, refusing, at the same time, to receive her as the Mother of mankind.

Fourth: Those who seek publicly to implant, in the hearts of children, indifference, disrespect, and even hatred of their Immaculate Mother.

Fifth: Insults directly against her sacred images.

To make this devotion, for five consecutive first Saturdays of the month, and with the intention of making reparation for the offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we are asked to:

- 1 Go to Confession (may be 8 days before or after, if you are in a state of grace)
- 2 Receive Holy Communion (can be received at a Sunday evening anticipatory Mass)
- 3 Pray five decades of the Rosary
- 4 Keep our Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes while meditating on one or more of the mysteries of the Rosary.
