FROM THE CORNER OFFICE...

(We continue with the Scrutiny Reading, in Cycle A this week)

Anointed to see... Can we reword that as: ***Called to see...*** Think about this week's readings: the *First Reading* has Samuel sent to anoint the chosen one who is one of Jesse's sons. The one to be anointed *ends up being David*, who was out with the sheep. Samuel tells the others, "*Not as Man sees does God see...but the LORD looks into the heart.*" This should make us all feel comforted, that God looks into *our hearts* as the place to *be, talk, and inspire us...in our hearts*. The *Second Reading* and the *Gospel* has Paul talking about *being a child of the light*, and then *Jesus curing the blind man*. **The movement is to see the world, Jesus, and God more clearly.** Yes, I agree, this is not the best Covid-friendly passage with Jesus making the clay and sending the man to wash in the pool. But let's move beyond that, **and ask how our vision is? Do we see God clearly, do we see Jesus in others (or even, ourselves?), and can we see God in our world? This last one can really be the challenge** given the hurt and ugliness of the news. But that is one of the biggest and more fruitful blessings that can help us. The challenge from *St. Ignatius Loyola, to see God in all things...* That means *seeing God in others, ourselves*, and not just nature or the easy things. Look around this week, not only with the flowers starting to poke through, but in the *more challenging corners of our lives*. If we can't see God in those corners, **well – let's do our job to bring God to the most challenging corners of our lives.**

Ash Wednesday, February 17th and Good Friday, April 2nd, are days of **abstinence** from meat (for those who have reached their fourteenth birthday) and also days of fast. The day of **fast** is limited to one full meal and two small meals (for those between the ages of 18 and 59). All Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion. **Prayer** opportunities include the Stations of the Cross on Tuesday evenings immediately following the 6:45PM Mass (around 7:15ish). An **almsgiving** opportunity is to participate in Operation Rice Bowl. **Confession** opportunities include Saturdays from 3-4pm. Please refer to the confession schedule.

SOLEMNITY OF SAINT JOSEPH

This year, the solemnity of Saint Joseph (March 19) falls on a Friday. As a solemnity, the requirement to abstain from meat on the Friday's within the season of Lent is dispensed for that day (see canon 1251). If they chose to make use of this special dispensation, the faithful are encouraged to choose another day during the week March 15-20 to abstain from meat as part of their Lenten observances.

On the solemnity of Saint Joseph it is the custom in some places to bless bread, pastries, and other food and give a large portion of it to the poor. A Family Ritual for this St. Joseph's Table blessing may be found on the Office for Worship website. We encourage all the faithful to use this solemnity as an opportunity to practice charitable almsgiving, living out the Lord's command to love our neighbor.

On March 19th, we celebrate the holiness in the midst of unpredictable fatherhood. We first meet Joseph when he discovers his betrothed is pregnant...and not by him! St. Joseph does not know who the father is (yet), but he knows the punishment for adultery is death. He decides to divorce Mary quietly, and thus save her life. When an angel appears to reveal that Mary is pregnant by the Holy Spirit, St. Joseph trusts his dream and marries her. As a new foster father, Joseph must help his wife give birth in a stable. Later, he needs to escape the threats to his son's life by immigrating with his family to a foreign land. We know that St. Joseph is faithful, brave, and willing to sacrifice for those he loves. On the solemnity of St. Joseph, we don't merely celebrate a carpenter. We celebrate a hero! ©LPI

"YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH"

Pope Francis has declared an entire year dedicated to St. Joseph. The Year of St. Joseph began on December 8, 2020 and continues until December 8, 2021.

A daily prayer to St. Joseph...and a challenge

In his letter, Pope Francis notes how, "Every day, for over forty years, following Lauds (Morning Prayer)" he has "recited a prayer to Saint Joseph taken from a nineteenth-century French prayer book of the Congregation of the sisters of Jesus and Mary." This prayer, he says, expresses devotion and trust, and even poses a certain challenge to Saint Joseph," on account of its closing words: "My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power."

At the conclusion of his Letter, Pope Francis added a daily prayer to St. Joseph, which he encourages all of us to pray together.
