

The Scrutiny's for our Elect continues this week at the Vigil Mass, and the Lenten journey through the readings of the Old Testament and the Gospel of St. John with this week including the familiar story of the Grain of Wheat. Now, if you are thinking it is not really that frequent that we hear it, well the Grieving Ministers and the volunteers helping at our funerals recognize it as a passage often used as the funeral Gospel reading. The First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah continues about God's covenant and it is reinforced with the Second Reading of St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews.
