



This Sunday, we celebrate "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe" or simply, Christ the King Day. Pope Pius XI originally initiated this day in 1925, and it has since grown to be observed by other Christian denominations. In 1969, Pope Paul VI revised the Roman calendar so that the day falls on the last Sunday of Ordinary time. With all of that, let's look at the readings, which The First Reading from the second Book of Samuel includes the story of David as being anointed at Hebron. This is different (a second version of...) from when David faced off with Goliath in the first Book of Samuel. David is the king of Israel! The Gospel according to Luke speaks now of Jesus as the king of the Jews. However, we find Jesus hanging on a cross between two thieves. What a difference... Music classes at St. Thomas More School.

In addition to being the Director of Music at the parish, I am also teaching music in the school. I have a Master's Degree in Music Education and 39 years of teaching experience. My goals are to teach the correct mechanics of singing to ensure good vocal health for the students, provide instruction in music reading/writing, and equip the students with skills to be able to create, appreciate and explore music through performing, composing, improvising, movement and more. One objective is to increase the student participation at weekly Mass so we spend a little time each lesson reviewing or learning some music for Church. The 5th grade is pictured rehearsing to lead the singing for school Mass. More classes are anxious to take their turn as leaders as well.



Students have learned songs from several countries and added instruments to their performances. During Latin American Heritage month we focused on songs, composers and instruments from Latin America and sang in Spanish. First and second graders can sing "Hello" in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and will soon be adding French, German and other languages.

Junior high students are discussing the various styles of singing and were amazed to see a video of the vocal cords at The students must be a member of Unity Catholic Federal work.

The students in PreK-5th grade will be presenting a Christmas program, so stay tuned to the bulletin for more details. We hope you will be able to join us for their performance.
