MARRIAGES

Should be arranged with a priest by calling the rectory 8 months prior to the wedding date. Individual conferences, plus attendance at a pre-marriage program, are required for proper preparation.

FROM THE CORNER OFFICE...

Admittedly, the readings this week have all the foundation of talking about fundraising and the collection numbers. But, I don't see this as the place, and (honestly...) I hate talking finances, at any level. These readings do speak of our trust in God, and how St. Paul speaks of Christ having given the ultimate sacrifice of dying for our salvation.

The First Reading from the First Book of Kings tells the story of Elijah asking for the widow to bake him a cake. This may be seen as demanding on Elijah's part, but it is in this action that the trust in God is shown by the widow. Even in the Gospel of St. Mark, there is a lesson of trust. Naturally, St. Mark has Jesus "people watching" and pointing out the sacrifice of the poor widow. Jesus points out to his disciples how the widow gave from her heart. This is the key line, "...she, [gave] from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." This can only be performed "with faith", faith that God will take care of all things. Let's all look for the opportunity to give from our livelihood ~ from our heart...
