

FROM THE CORNER OFFICE

The *Thirty-First Sunday of Ordinary Time* brings us to **Jesus** calling us <u>out of our comfort zones</u>. The *First Reading* from the **Book of Wisdom** is from a section speaking of **God's** deliverance of **Israel** from Egypt. The wonder of **God's** control over the forces of nature and the endless mercy from **God**. The letter to the **Thessalonians** speaks of the "...day of the **Lord** is at hand." The time is here for us to stand-up and be counted. The short passage from St. Luke's gospel tells the story of the tax collector, **Zacchaeus**. **Jesus** is entering the town and **Zacchaeus** climbs the tree for a better view, which begs the question – was **Jesus** short and not able to be seen, or was **Zacchaeus** short and not able to see **Jesus**, interesting to think about... **BUT**, given **Zacchaeus** is now in the tree, able to see above the crowd, safe and away from the crowd, and (maybe) even thinking he's outsmarted the crowd since now he can see – what does **Jesus** do? He calls **Zacchaeus** down from the tree, out of his comfort zone, and (even) humbled a bit since he didn't outsmart **Jesus**. Question for us all this week: What will it take for us to come down out of the tree, out of our comfort zone, and (yes, even) humble ourselves to grow closer to our **God**, **Jesus**, and the **Holy Spirit**?


