Should be arranged with a priest by calling the rectory 8 months prior to the wedding date. Individual conferences, plus attendance at a pre-marriage program, are required for proper preparation.

This week we have Jesus talking with the scribes as others looked on and he simply "Drops the Mic!" Yes, we are called to love, but we know that Jesus gives us his perfect love, that love on the cross. *Next time we find it challenging to ask what love is, simply look up to the cross and see...*

#### NOVEMBER MEMORIAL CANDLES


