

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 9, 2022

FROM THE CORNER OFFICE

The Twentieth-Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time continues with Jesus using the Samaritan as the example in this passage from the Gospel of Luke. Notice both Naathan and the Samaritan being outsiders. Like an onion, there are many layers to this week's readings. The first level is the healing power of God, then the help to all God's people – even beyond the Israelites, the persistence preached by St. Paul to Timothy (and the others...), and also (again) Jesus reaching out to those outside the circle of the Israelites. Now the final core of all of these readings is "being grateful" for the love of God which heals all of us – not just a few. Remember that this is our spiritual healing. Yes, as Naaman and the Samaritan leper found out, it is just that simple, being present to God and Jesus, with a desire to be healed. If we put ourselves in God's presence or with Jesus, what is it that we would need healing from? and would we be grateful?


