

#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

The Lord be with you! It brings me great joy to be your new pastor. I will admit that leaving Garfield Heights saddened me - I made many great friends there and will miss them. God has consoled me with the knowledge that I am doing his Will in coming to St. Thomas More.

Here is a brief autobiography. I was born in Cleveland, Ohio to James and Mary Schneider; I was the first of six children. If you think that is a large family consider this: I have fifty-six cousins! Anyways, my family eventually moved to Avon Lake, but I can still remember going to Memphis Kiddie Park and Big Creek.

I attended St. Vincent de Paul in Cleveland for grade school before going to St. Ignatius High School. Afterwards, I attended the University of Notre Dame on a full academic scholarship majoring in Latin and Philosophy. I had discerned my vocation to the priesthood while in high school, but my pastor encouraged me to delay going to the seminary. Once I had graduated college, however, I went straight to First Theology at our local seminary, St. Mary's. Five years later I was ordained a priest in 2011.

My first assignment as a priest of Cleveland was at Holy Family Parish in Parma where I served under Fr. Richard Evans. I learned a great deal at Holy Family and still have friends from that parish. In 2015 I left that parish to become a Parochial Vicar at St. John Vianney's in Mentor under Fr. Tom Johns. That assignment lasted a whole three months before I was promoted. In September 2015, I became administrator of Immaculate Conception in Madison, Ohio. Bishop Lennon asked me to take on that assignment since I would be filling in for my uncle, Fr. Sean Donnelly, who had to go on medical leave. Fortunately, my uncle recovered from his illness and resumed his duties as pastor in February 2016.

I thought that I would get a little respite, but three weeks after my uncle came back I was given Ss. Peter & Paul in Garfield Heights. Six months later I was made their pastor "and" pastor of St. Therese on October 1, 2016. For eight years, I had those two small parishes, and we had a lot of fun.

It came as a complete shock to me two months ago when the bishop asked me to come to St. Thomas More. I took his request to prayer, and God gave me a very clear answer: do what the bishop asks. I was not the first priest asked, but I was the first to say "yes."

Now starts a period of adjustment for all of us, so let us pray for one another. As we get to know each other, I am sure that we will learn to rejoice in our gifts and God's grace. God be with you.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the Catholic Tradition of responsible citizenship, we are morally obligated to participate in political life and to make choices based on a properly formed conscience, voting for the candidates who best support the moral teachings of our Catholic faith. As you prepare to cast your ballot for the upcoming November election, I ask that you pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and educate yourself on the candidates' positions on the critical issues that will affect us all, both now and in the future.

Before we are members of any political party, we must be faithful followers of Jesus, who told us "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 3:35). So, it is incumbent on us who are believers to live our Catholic faith outside the walls of our Churches, putting Christ at the center of our public lives as citizens. Our consciences must be well informed through prayer and fidelity to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Then we must vote our consciences, which I urge you to do, so that your Catholic faith will impact the moral and social fabric of our society.

In the Introductory Note to Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the document issued by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to help guide us on our political responsibilities, we bishops again said that the defense of unborn life remains our pre-eminent priority because abortion is a direct attack on the most vulnerable among us. We also recognize that other grave threats to the life and dignity of the human person include euthanasia, gun violence, terrorism, the death penalty, human trafficking, the redefinition of marriage and gender, threats to religious freedom, lack of justice for the poor, the suffering of migrants and refugees, racism, and the lack of care for our common home. All these issues must be considered when voting for the person who will best represent us, placing the interests of the most vulnerable first among others.

At a time when our nation is so polarized by partisanship and ideology, and the issues are so serious and complex, it is of the utmost importance that we persevere in hope, remembering the words found in the Book of Micah, who said, "You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the Lord requires of you: Only to do justice and love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8).

For those looking for more information on faithful citizenship, both the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Catholic Conference of Ohio (which outlines topics specific to our state) offer extensive materials and resources to provide guidance.

Please join me in praying for all those who are running for office in the upcoming election. May the Lord inspire and guide them to lift up the dignity of all persons they will serve if chosen by the electorate. May the Lord guide us in these important decisions at this critical time in our history, heal our divisions, and unite us one nation, under God.
